Dear Parents and Carers,

The last newsletter I wrote was in March 2020!!! So much has happened since then, it is quite unbelievable. I think my words in that newsletter were, 'It has been a challenging month!' Little did we know what was going to happen in the coming months - the whole world turned upside down. However we are now all back together and I hope that life at Holland Haven continues in this way.

The artwork above has been donated to our school by Mrs Bradbury. Her son Jethro Wilson is an ex pupil of Holland Haven and he is now an illustrator working in Bournemouth. We will be placing the print in our school entrance. Jethro says that, 'This is our world, we are all in this together. I believe that united we can change the world.'

A great deal of preparation and planning has gone into the reorganising of the school for the Autumn Term. Despite the message given to the public that schools were closed, Holland Haven remained open throughout the lockdown and the Easter holidays so that key worker pupils could attend. From 1st June the school was open to key worker families, Year R,1 and 6 and approximately one fifth of our school population decided to attend. We have now welcomed back all of our pupils including EYFS and it is, quite frankly, as if the children have never been away. I would like to thank all of my staff for their dedication and support during this time.

It may be the case, in the coming months, that we have to make additional changes but I will inform you in good time if we need to do this. We don't know what the future holds and the government rarely sees fit to inform us before informing the whole country about changes, so unfortunately I sometimes have to react to their guidance at a moment's notice.

There have already been some big changes in school procedures since the start of September. If a child or member of staff has COVID symptoms we no longer send a bubble home straight away. We now have to ask the parents to book a test for their child and if the test is positive, we then have to ring the DFE helpline to get instructions for our actions.

Last week, headteachers in our area met (virtually) with the Director of Education for Essex and the Director of Heath for Essex. From this meeting it was established that a two metre distance for adults and the wearing of face coverings will indeed reduce the risk of transmission. If you wear a face covering, you are actually protecting those around you; if we are all wearing them we will be protecting each other. So I am, once again, asking all adults coming onto the school site to wear face coverings and stand at least 2 metres apart when collecting and dropping off pupils. Thank you so much to all of you who are already doing this. We really do appreciate it.

I will, of course, keep you all updated if we have any issues and with any additional information.

On a brighter note, this year is the school's **50th anniversary**. Teachers will be organising activities for their class to recognise it, but sadly we cannot celebrate as a whole school. We are hoping that later in the school year we will be able to celebrate together. Teachers will be placing photos of events on their webpages. This photo is a piece of artwork by UD.
