# Spelling Progress

Well done to all pupils regularly practising their spellings at home on the online school-account Ed Shed (Spelling Shed) - login details are in your child's small red A5 Home School Book.

The government expectation is that pupils will complete Spelling Set 1 by the end of Year 2, Spelling Set 2 by the end of Year 4 and Spelling Set 3 by the end of Year 6.

At the beginning of this academic year, a significant proportion of pupils were not on track to meet these requirements and so we improved the existing system of half-termly testing of the individualised Home School Book spellings to include these words in the online Spelling Shed games. We also discontinued the word patterns lists that were previously shared as additional homework so families could just focus on these statutory words. The patterns continue to be taught and explored in school.

We are now seeing great progress where pupils are practising both the patterns and words in school, and these personalised spellings at home online.

Please let your class teacher know if you have any questions or need support accessing Ed Shed. We have attached the information letter again at the end of this newsletter. Although there is only 1 homework activity-week allocated to spellings (and times tables) in order to provide a protected opportunity for this learning, pupils are encouraged to practise little and often in between as well.

Thank you for your support.

#### Staff Car Park and Parking

The school car park is a private car park for staff **ONLY**. Please could I ask that parents **do not** park in the school car park.

Please may we remind parents not to park on the grass verges or on double yellow lines. Also, could you please respect our neighbours and do not park over their drives. Thank you.

#### Attendance

If you leave a voice message that your child is not feeling well and will not be attending school, the school office may follow this up with a call back to you. If there is no response to the call, we will request a home visit from the Aquinas team.

We will require as much information as possible about your child's illness. If your child has antibiotics prescribed, please can you send us a screenshot of them and if you have a doctor's appointment, please can you send a screenshot of the appointment booking.

Family holidays will **NOT** be authorised.

Overall attendance is 94.7% Ofsted expect at least 95% attendance so we are currently just below this figure. Please help us improve our attendance by making sure your child is in school every day.

#### New Attendance Raffle and Rewards

Each week, if a pupil has been in school 100% they will receive a raffle ticket. This ticket is placed in a key stage draw. At each half term, a ticket will be drawn from the KS2 box and also from the KS1/EYFS box. The **two** pupils drawn in the raffles will each receive a **£20 Amazon voucher.** The March draw took place on 28th March and the winners were Toby Swift and Bella Birkett. Well done!

Class attendance will also be rewarded each term. The class with the highest attendance will have a 'treat afternoon' which the class will choose with the class teacher.

# Governors' Corner

How do you get your child to school in the mornings? Chances are that you either walk, cycle or take them in the car. I would like to tell you about some interesting research which shows that parents who walk or cycle are likely to report greater levels of satisfaction and better mental health than those who use a car. The benefits of exercise are obvious and inspired by this research, a headteacher friend of mine in Spain, brought in a points system to encourage parents who did use a car, to park some distance away and to complete the last part of the journey on foot. This is, of course, the right time of year to try this as it takes a little longer to walk and in the mornings you are always pushed for time. In Clacton there is plenty of space on the seafront so you can park easily and it is possible to walk the last part of your journey on foot.

I have to admit that I was delighted about the research.

I also asked my own child (who is now in his 40s) what he enjoyed most about his time at primary school at Chingford C of E and "I remember walking to school. That was the best bit." was his reply.
