Dear Parents and Carers,

It was certainly a mad panic coming back to school in January with one day to, once again, organise another lockdown system. The new variant sent us all into a spin and we have certainly noticed a difference in COVID cases in our school community this term. So far we have had 7 pupils that we have been made aware of, with positive COVID test results. I would like to wish all of our families affected by COVID all the best.

Since lockdown, schools have been told that all SATs tests in KS1 and 2 and the EYFS profile assessment will not be taking place this year. Many children have had numerous absences during the year and with those absences on top of lockdown, it has meant that pupils now have gaps in their learning.

Well done to all of our pupils who are taking part in our remote learning package. We have released 4 members of staff to deliver this package throughout the week. Engagement is excellent. Teachers are also connecting with their clases through Zoom fortnightly. Thank you very much for all of your positive comments and emails.

During half term I will be, once again, supporting Track and Trace. The following information will only be relevant to pupils who have been attending school. If, in the <u>first 48 hours only</u>, your child shows COVID symptoms and s/he later tests positive for COVID 19, please can you email me between **9am and 11am** using the email <u>s.bardetti@hollandhavenschool.co.uk</u>. You will need to isolate your child and your whole household for 10 days.

If your child shows symptoms **after the 48 hours** you will need to book a COVID test and if this is positive you will need to isolate your child and household for 10 days. Please contact the school on **Monday 22nd February** to report your child's absence.

Obviously we do not know when this lockdown will come to an end and what the procedures will be once it does, but I will keep you all informed, updating you when I am provided with information.

I hope you have a restful half term break.
