Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the October newsletter. I am so happy to report that everything is going very well in school so far. Despite cases of COVID rising in Essex we are managing to operate as normal (or as normal as we can be in the current situation).

Our attendance rate is very good indeed and we are at 96.8% currently so well done and thank you.

We are very excited about introducing our new Purple Mash platform this month and I hope that you have all received my email regarding its introduction. You should also have had an additional sheet in your child's homework book with all login information which you can keep at home. It may be that your child is unable to attend at some point due to COVID restrictions, so the additional loose sheet will ensure you have access to your child's online learning logins at all times. Purple Mash is for use in school lessons, homework and for pupils who are self isolating due to them, or a household member, having COVID 19 and isolation is required.

So far we have been able to deliver most of our intended curriculum and last week Year 5 and 6 pupils went to the beach as part of their War and Conflict topic. Everybody enjoyed the visit and it was so good to be able to venture outside of our school site for the first time this school year.

I have recently sent you another letter regarding the wearing of face coverings on our school site. Many parents have expressed their concerns about parents not responding to this request. I hope that you can help us all stay safe and wear a visor or face covering when collecting and dropping off your child each day. Please remember not to ask teachers to discuss issues at the classroom door. If a teacher falls ill with COVID, it would probably mean that the whole class has to self isolate, so please ring the school office if you have any questions or concerns.

On a similar note, if your child is advised by another establishment to self isolate due to having contact with a person with COVID please can you ensure that this advice is adhered to and do not send your child to school.

As a treat for all of our pupils, I have booked an online pantomime (Cinderella Live) which can be watched from the safety of our classrooms. This will take place towards the end of the Autumn Term. We have to try to keep some things normal after all!

I hope that you all have a restful and safe half term holiday.
